HISTORY

WWII brought about a vast variety of "new" things. One of them was the M-1 carbine. It was developed in a short time span, and by the time production had ceased, 6.5 million had been produced. It was never intended to be a replacement for the M-1 "Garand" rifle. It was designed to be an effective light rifle to take the place of the .45 pistol. In the effort to design a light rifle, Winchester came up with the accepted design. It soon became evident that Winchester could not produce enough of the carbines to meet the need for weapons. In all, ten compa-

nies were set up to build them. So, that made for a serious lineup for collectors. Original rifles have now become an expensive collector's item. Back in the 50's you could buy one from the Civilian Marksmanship Program for \$15. Now, because supplies have been bought up by collectors, there are few originals on the market. Two companies have come on line to offer new ones made to original specs. Now you can purchase a "new" Rock-Ola, or Inland Mfg Co. carbine in the \$1200 range. So, now if you cannot find an original one, you can buy a new one. There are, no doubt, thousands of these little rifles in warehouses around the world. The government won't let them back into this country for collectors to snap up. Anyway, these much sworn by (or sworn at) rifles are now available once more.
